

ACCESS TO INTERPRETATION: Self-Assessment Tool for Canadian Provinces

RECOMMENDATION:

Effective communication is essential to delivering high-quality, equitable healthcare. Language barriers remain a significant obstacle for many patients, limiting access, understanding, and outcomes. To help address this, N4 (National Newcomer Navigation Network) developed a recommended pan-Canadian standard in which provincial ministries of health fund centralized interpretation services that include both virtual and in-person options for all publicly funded healthcare.
